Dear Residents, Family Members and Friends,

We are pleased to announce that Mr. Brian Montgomery, the Assistant Secretary for Housing – Federal Housing Commissioner for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will be visiting Mathison in person next week as part of a tour to view the damage caused by Hurricane Michael. You may be aware that Mathison's financing is FHA insured, and we are honored to be chosen as one of his visit sites. In addition to overseeing a number of HUD programs, Mr. Montgomery is responsible for managing the nation's entire FHA insurance portfolio.

With respect to the current status of the community, we will be completing the air quality testing next week, so we are requesting that residents and family members hold off for one more week on visiting Mathison to retrieve personal items from the apartments. By the end of next week, we should be complete with material removal, and access to the apartments will be granted again beginning Nov. 26. At the same time, we will begin the sheetrock repairs and painting. The roof is still undergoing evaluation, but we have now ordered 61,173 square feet of flooring materials!

Now that we have greater clarity with respect to many of our insurance details and restoration components, a better picture of a reopening timeline is beginning to emerge. It is our intention to reopen Mathison by the end of February. There are a number of factors that could affect our reopening, particularly as it concerns the coordination of skilled labor in the area. There are a lot of restoration jobs in Panama City and the surrounding areas that are all being requested at the same time, and the size of a skilled labor force for these jobs is unclear. We will continue to keep you updated regularly.
